Abstract: This collection contains mostly ledgers, but it also contains yearbooks, meeting minutes, and reference books. Furthermore, the ledgers contain information for newspapers, hardware stores, and stationary sales. The ledgers come from five different counties in Missouri: Bollinger, St.Louis, Jefferson, Scott, and Cape Girardeau.

Historical Note:

The Bollinger County Museum of Natural History (BCMNH) started as the Will Mayfield Heritage Foundation in Marble Hill, Missouri. This foundation was started in 1998 to preserve the history of the Will Mayfield College. In 2004, the museum officially became a non-profit organization and opened its doors to the public. In 2021, the museum closed permanently, but the foundation still works to preserve the history of Bollinger County and the Will Mayfield College. When it was open, the museum had two types of exhibits: historical and natural history. The exhibits included Native Americans, Civil War, Will Mayfield College, Geology, Mammals of North America, and Dinosaurs.

The BCMNH was located in the old Administration building of the college, while the Bollinger County Public Library is located in what was once the Arts and Science Building. The Will Mayfield College was established in 1878 by two doctors: William Henderson Mayfield and H. J. Smith. The school was originally called the Mayfield-Smith Academy and was associated with a Baptist church. Students who attended school there were offered a variety of traditional courses like English, math, and science, but they were also offered classes related to bookkeeping, typing, and music. Because this school was focused on higher education, there were several advanced courses students could take as well as religion courses. There were three buildings on campus: College Hall, the Administration Building/Memorial Hall, and Rosemont Hall. Currently, College Hall and the Administration are the only buildings left due to a fire in 1927 that destroyed Rosemont Hall, the women's dormitory. In 1904, Will Mayfield's son passed away, and the board of the school renamed the college Will Mayfield College.

William Henderson Mayfield was born January 18, 1852 to George W. Mayfield and Polly B. Cheek. After childhood, Will Mayfield attended college at Carleton College in Farmington, Missouri and Fruitland Normal Institute in Jackson, Missouri where he studied teaching. In 1877, Mayfield was appointed General Agent of Castor Church where he began his proposal for the Will Mayfield College. He raised over one thousand dollars to establish the school because he believed there needed to be more educated and religious people in the area. In 1878, Mayfield attended St. Louis Medical College to earn a degree in medicine. After he earned his degree he founded multiple Baptist sanitariums in St. Louis, some of which still exist today, and the Mayfield Sanitarium. He married Ellen Catherine Sitzes and together they had four children: Ida G., William Henderson, Cary Judson, and Male Mayfield. William Henderson Mayfield died on September 12, 1916 in St. Louis, Missouri.

Ledgers Yearbooks Published Materials

Scope and Content Note:

Ledgers

This series contains ledgers from different businesses as well as a Reference Book and Log of Contractor Charges from Otis Hahn, a receipt book from 1941-1942, a Soils Lab notebook from Bollinger County, and a violation reports notebook from 1949-1950. The ledgers are from the Banner Press in Marble Hill, the Slagle Store in Zalma, and Lutes and Hartle Store in an unnamed city. Additionally, there are two unlabeled ledgers and two ledgers that contain minutes from Bollinger County Bank and the Trustees of the Village of Lutesville. The ledgers range in dates from 1912-1947. Of interest is the ledger from the Trustees of Lutesville. This ledger contains the creation of many ordinances from the city. Additionally of interest, the Bollinger County Bank ledger contains a statement of the closing of the bank in 1914.

Yearbooks

This series consists of yearbooks from three different schools in Missouri: Hillsboro High School, Oran High School, and the State Teacher's College (now Southeast Missouri State University). The dates for the Hillsboro High School yearbooks are from 1944-1945, 1946, 1948, and 1949. There is one Oran High School yearbook from 1921, and there are three Sagamore (State Teacher's College) yearbooks from 1922, 1923, and 1925.

Published Materials

This series contains four reference books including volumes one through three of the *History of Southeast Missouri* by Louis Houck, and a biography of William Henderson Mayfield.
