Historical Note:

Clyde Faries was born in Rombauer, Missouri, on July 8, 1928. His parents were Darcy Orton and Inis Faries. Clyde earned a PhD in Rhetoric and Public Address from University of Missouri and was a professor and department chair at Western Illinois University until his retirement in the 1980s. In addition to his love of academia, Faries was interested in music and folklore, serving as president of the Missouri Folklore Society for a time, and performed British and American folk music. Clyde passed on March 26, 2019.

Charles Farris was born in 1925 and lived in Farmington, Missouri. He was a folk musician and member of Missouri Folklore Society, primarily known for harmonica and guitar. He passed away in 1995.
