Abstract: The papers of a family from the Nodaway County, Missouri, area include photographs, correspondence, scrapbooks, family Bible, clippings, postcards, small artifacts, and miscellaneous material. Includes material on James H. Lemon and Kathleen Jones; World War II correspondence of Frank Paul Jones who was stationed in Arkansas during the war; and photographs of the related Cowden family.

Historical Note:

Both Jones and Lemon families were prominent figures in early 20th century Nodaway County, Missouri. Horace Jones, once labeled the town Parnell's "leading citizen," was born in 1847 and came to Missouri from Wapello, Iowa. During his lifetime, Jones purchased upwards of six thousand acres of land in Nodaway County which housed Parnell's schoolhouse, parks, and cemetery. At the time of his death in 1915, many business and residential lots in Parnell belonged to Jones. Jones came to Missouri with his wife, Ella Cotter, with whom he had three children: Edward, Austine, and Matie (Felton) Jones. Edward Jones married into the Lemon family and had three children with Nell Lemon: Kathleen, Frank, and Emily Jones. Emily Jones married Bernard Cowden. The couple had two children, Bill and Nell Cowden. Kathleen Jones attended college at both the Missouri State Teachers College, now Northwest Missouri State University, and the University of Nebraska. She worked as a teacher for many years.

James Harvey Lemon, born in Illinois in 1842, brought the Lemon family to Missouri. After fighting for the Union in the Civil War, Lemon and his wife Emily Kautz moved to Nodaway County and created a successful farm. Lemon was elected to the Missouri House of Representatives and in 1905 introduced House Bill No. 311, the "Nodaway County Normal Bill." This bill allowed for the creation of a normal school, or teachers' college, in Nodaway County, the institution that would later become Northwest Missouri State University. Lemon died in Clearmont, Missouri in 1917. Lemon and his wife Emily were the parents of Nellie June Lemon, who married Edward Jones.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged chronologically into 67 folders. Photographs are arranged by size.

Scope and Content Note:

Folders 2-7 consist of photographs of the Lemon, Jones, Cowden, and Kautz families, along with notes for context added by Nell Cowden. Folders 10-11 include a 19th century Bible and notes belonging to Mary Ann Kautz. In folders 13-15 are three scrapbooks with newspaper clippings on various subjects. The scrapbook in folder 13 includes information on the American economy in the 1890s. The scrapbook in folder 14 dates to around 1919 and includes human-interest news stories as well as articles about the aftermath of World War I. Folder 15 consists of a "household suggestions" scrapbook made from a World War II tax advice booklet. Other World War II items include Pvt. Frank Jones' correspondence, identification bracelet, and draft documentation. Folder 58 includes various undated artifacts, including a large photo button, a letter opener, and political pins. Folders 59-67 consist of oversize certificates and diplomas belonging to several members of the family.
