#### **Historical Note:**

Samuel S. Robinson was born on August 16, 1937, in Chester County, Pennsylvania, to Joseph Robinson and Jane Mahafy. In 1860, he lived with the Lamb family of Perry County, Ohio, as a day laborer before enlisting in the Union Army in 1861. After the war, he married Priscilla Robinson, and the couple had five children: Ida, Flora, Nellie, William, and Mae. Samuel S. Robinson died on May 13, 1925, in Mount Vernon, Indiana. He was preceded in death by his wife, Priscilla, who died on March 25, 1917.

Mae Robinson was born March 5, 1885, to Samuel and Priscilla Robinson. She married Albert Reel in St. Louis, Missouri, on July 30, 1909. The couple lived in Taney County, Missouri, where Albert worked as a realtor from 1943 to 1956, before moving to Republic, Missouri. The couple later moved to Warsaw, Missouri. Mae Reel died on December 5, 1980; she was preceded in death by her husband Albert who died on April 13, 1965. The couple are buried in Evergreen Cemetery in Republic.

# **Scope and Content Note:**

The Robinson Family Papers contain correspondence, photographs, and personal papers belonging to the Robinson family of Missouri and Indiana. The correspondence folder contains postcards between the Robinson siblings, including Mae and Albert Reel. This folder also includes letters from the Harrow Relief Society offering condolences to the Robinson family after Samuel S. Robinson's death. The photographs include images of Samuel S. Robinson, Mae and Albert Reel, the Lamb family, and three unidentified Union soldiers. The collection also contains Samuel S. Robinson's pension records and a birthday card book addressed to Priscilla Robinson. In addition, there are two Taney County, Missouri, land deeds belonging to Malinda Cook in 1859, and Enos Stanley in 1873, for Section 20 & 21, Township 24, and Range 18. This collection is arranged by subject and then chronologically.
