**Abstract:** The Carpenter Family Collection contains personal papers, photographs, and records of the Carpenter family, as well as related families including the O'Bryant and Hood families of Greene County, Missouri. The collection also contains early images of Greene County, Missouri, North Powder, Oregon, and California towns and landscapes.

**Historical Note:**

George Washington O'Bryant, Sr., born in 1823, came to Missouri with his parents when he was young. He came of age on a farm in Cedar County before moving to Greene County. He married Mary Caroline Howard in 1851 and served as a member of the Home Guards during the Civil War, acting as one of the guides of General Lyon's army to Wilson's Creek and being present for the various engagements that occurred in Springfield. Mary Caroline, child of Woodson Howard and Abigail Alice Finley, emigrated from North Carolina to Missouri in 1839. They settled near what is now Battlefield, near the James River in Greene County, Missouri, and established their own farm where Mary Caroline was reared. Following their union, George and Mary Caroline had nine children with eight living into adulthood. The children, Mary Frances (Taylor), Martha Ann (Phillips), twins William T. and Delilah (Lawson), Alice Abigail (Camp), Nancy Caroline (Crouch), George Washington, Jr., and James Henry, were all active in Greene County and became prominent members alongside their father. George Washington O'Bryant passed on his farm in 1866, but Mary Caroline lived on as a widow until 1903.

James Duncan Hood was born in Greene County, Missouri on December 31, 1848, to Duncan Hood and Nancy Blades. He married Mary Elizabeth Clack, daughter of Robert Kerr Clack and Rachael Bonham, in 1872, and the couple had six children with three living into adulthood. Those three children were Margaret Lucinda Emaline Hood (O'Bryant), Knox Hood, and Clyde Hood. James Hood and Mary Elizabeth Hood also adopted and reared a child named Mary Elizabeth "Hicklin" Hauley. James D. Hood was a prominent farmer and livestock owner in Greene County, at one point owning "The Sunrise Stock Farm." He was also active as a member of the Ancient Free and Accepted Masons before passing in 1932. His wife, Mary Elizabeth Hood, often referred to later as "Grandma Hood," preceded him in death in 1927.

The two families discussed above became united with the union of James Henry O'Bryant and Margaret Lucinda Emaline Hood. James Henry, born in 1866 near Republic, Greene County, Missouri, was raised on his father's farm and quickly became a farmer himself. He married Margaret, or "Maggie," in 1901 before moving to Springfield, Missouri. Here he served as a delivery man for the Springfield postal service, a policeman for thirteen years, and a politician before returning to his farm. He and Maggie had nine children: Nell Alice (McDonnel), James Earl, Leta Fay (Beebe), Elias Bates, Mary Tennessee (Carpenter) (Martin), John Robert, Helen Lucile (Funke), Hazel Caroline (Osborn), and Howard Hood. They raised their children on their farm and, once their children had grown and left, returned to their residence in Springfield in 1938. James Henry O'Bryant passed in 1947 and was proceeded in death by his wife Maggie O'Bryant in 1958. The couple were buried in Evergreen Cemetery in Republic, Missouri.

Mary Tennessee O'Bryant, a prominent figure in this collection, was born to James Henry O'Bryant and Margaret Hood in 1902. She would have a brief marriage with Harry Lee Carpenter, which resulted in one son, Richard Lee Carpenter, before marrying Linzy Martin in 1944. Mary's son Richard safely returned from his service in World War II, but Linzy's only son, Wendell Linzy Martin, did not, being killed in action while serving in the U.S. Navy in 1944.

Following Mary and Linzy's retirement in 1963, they used their railroad passes to travel as much as possible across the U.S. to visit relatives and national parks. Linzy Martin passed in 1980, while Mary Tennessee, who had reached over 100 years of life, passed in 2006.

Harry Lee Carpenter was born on August 12, 1901, to James Edward Carpenter and Dora Eglantine Skeen in Chilhowee, Missouri. Harry married Mary Tennessee O'Bryant in 1924. The couple had one son named Richard. Following their separation, Harry married Abby Geneva Warren in 1930 and had one son, Dr. Warren Lee Carpenter, born in 1931. Both relocated to Little Rock, Arkansas, where Abby Warren passed in 1968. Harry also opened his own business, Harry L. Carpenter Motors there. He passed in 1994.

Richard Lee "Dick" Carpenter was born in 1924 to Harry Carpenter and Mary Tennessee, in Springfield, Missouri. He attended Springfield High School and graduated with the class of 1942, before serving in World War II from 1944 to 1945. He married Martha Hoover in 1948 with two children born to the union, Mark in 1951 and Mary Elizabeth (Wiley) in 1954. He would later take up a career as a jewelry engraver, where his company even crafted jewelry for CD Peacock in Chicago. He and his family relocated to Carlsbad, California. Richard's death date is unknown.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

#### **Carpenter Family**

This series contains materials related to the Carpenter Family, including three subseries on correspondence, genealogical research, and personal papers. The correspondence, dating from 1922 to 2014, includes mostly letters sent from Harry Lee Carpenter to his son, Richard Lee Carpenter, but also Harry's letters to Mary Tennessee O'Bryant Martin, James Hood's letters to Richard, and Mary Carpenter's letters to Richard and his family. Also included within the correspondence is Richard Carpenter's v-mail to his mother Mary Tennessee Martin, while serving in WWII. Throughout these v-mail letters, Richard discusses his life on camp and abroad, often mentioning what he deems the interesting quirks of Australians and military life.

Included in the genealogy subseries is research predominately compiled by Gray Carpenter Church, which maps multiple family lines from the Carpenters, O'Bryants, and Hoods to the Clacks, Bonhams, and Blades. There are also excerpts on the family's prevalence in the early settling of Greene County, Missouri, and stories written by different family members about what

life was like. Some of these stories include James Henry O'Bryant's time as a postal delivery man for the Springfield Post Office and the celebration of 100 years of life for Mary Tennessee Martin.

The personal papers subseries contains various kept materials of the family, including three different campaign cards for James Henry O'Bryant from 1896 to 1934, the Springfield High School Yearbook from 1907-1908 named *The Resume*, a volume on extracurricular activities at Jarrett Junior High School, a CD containing a short film made by Richard Lee Carpenter, artwork created by Harry Lee Carpenter, and probate records belonging to Harry Carpenter and Mary Carpenter. The CD contains footage from the 1960s, displaying 60s fashion and automobiles. There is also an extended montage of Richard engraving different pieces of jewelry and metal pieces. This series, including all three subseries, is arranged by subject and then chronologically.

## Photographs

This series contains two subseries, Family Photographs and Buildings and Landscapes Photographs. The Family Photographs subseries consists of photographs of the Carpenter, O'Bryant, and Hood families of Greene County, Missouri. This subseries also contains a folder of extended and or unidentified family members and individuals. The O'Bryant family photographs, ranging from 1891 to 2000, is the largest collection of the series and includes multiple family, individual, and professional portraits. The Buildings and Landscapes subseries contains both early photographs of Missouri, including different family residences and locations in Springfield, Marionville, Republic, and Lebanon, and of other states, such as North Powder, Oregon, California, and the Grand Canyon. Both subseries are arranged by subject and then chronologically.

## Oversize

This series consists of oversized items including Richard Carpenter's diploma from Springfield High School, oversized family photos, photo albums, and the volume *Honor Roll of Greene County, Missouri*. The oversized photos contain two portraits of Mary Tennessee O'Bryant Martin and one O'Bryant family photograph. The Photo Album subseries consists of four volumes of family photos, including some taken in North Powder, Oregon, and Idaho. These albums range from 1915 to 1932 and include photographs of various O'Bryant family members and extended family. The *Honor Roll of Greene County, Missouri* provides photographs and an indexed list of soldiers and organizations from Greene County, Missouri, who served or assisted in World War I. There are also photographs of various military forces, in and out of the country, military operations, and speeches given by various military leaders, such as the President of the United States, Theodore Roosevelt.
