Abstract: The Eddleman Family Papers includes correspondence between Barbara and Christopher Eddleman and their four sons, William H., Harley, Riley Russell, Rodney J. during World War II. William H. Eddleman died as a prisoner of war in the Philippines in 1942. Included in this collection is correspondence from the War Department about his death benefits to his parents, William H. Breen, Jr. and his wife Enid Breen, and Abie Abraham, after the war. Abraham was with William when he died.

Biographical Note:

Christopher C. Eddleman and Barbara A. Fulbright were married on January 1, 1905 in Cape Girardeau County. They moved to Cape Girardeau in the 1940s. The couple had eleven children, six boys and five girls. During World War II two of their sons served their country, William H. and Riley Russell. Another son, Rodney J. served in United States Marine Corps in 1948. William H. Eddleman served in Company E, 27th Infantry in 1934. Later, he served as sergeant in the 31st Infantry Regiment in 1940. Eddleman died while held as a prisoner of war by the Japanese in the Philippines on August 12, 1942. Riley served from 1944-1945 in the Netherlands and Moluccas Islands rising to the rank of corporal in the 2nd Air Service Squadron.

Scope and Content Note:

The Eddleman Family Papers contain forty letters written between the Christopher C. and Barbara Eddleman and their four sons, William H., Harley, Riley R. and Rodney J. while they were serving in the military during World War II from 1934-1948. The majority of letters were written between the brothers. Correspondence is also included from Enid Eddleman Breen (sister) and her husband, William H. Breen, Jr. Of interest is correspondence of Abie Abraham. He served with William H. Eddleman while he was a prisoner of war and tracked down the family several years after the war.

Also included is correspondence with the War Department regarding death benefits for William.
