Historical Note:

Jeanette Marie Vandeven was born on October 1, 1932, in Cape Girardeau, Missouri, a daughter of William Henry Vandeven and Mary L. Vandeven (nee Burger). She graduated from St. Mary

High School and Southeast Missouri State Teacher's College. She married Robert J. Dohogne on January 28, 1961, at St. Mary's Cathedral in Cape Girardeau. She worked as an elementary school teacher for St. Mary's, St. Vincent de Paul Catholic Church schools, as well as other schools in the area. She died on June 9, 2019, and was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery in Cape Girardeau.

William Henry Vandeven was born on February 16, 1904, in Cape Girardeau, Missouri, a son of John A. Vandeven and Lena Nenninger. He graduated from Central High School in 1922 and married Mary Burger in 1928. The Vandeven family ran one of the longest continuously operated stores in Cape Girardeau. Vandeven Mercantile Company served the residents of Cape Girardeau and the surrounding area for 75 years. John H. Sanders opened the business in 1894 with William's father, John taking over in 1928. Members of the Vandeven family continuously operated the store until its closing on April 5, 1969.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged alphabetically.

Scope and Content Note:

The Vandeven Family Papers include childhood, family, and wedding photographs of Jeanette and William D. Vandeven from 1938 to 1963. This collection also includes William Henry Vandeven's 50-year membership in the Knights of Columbus program and certificate. Additionally, there are a few photographs of members of Schonhoff and Nenninger allied families. An oversized folder contains William Vandeven's high school diploma, marriage certificate, and wedding photograph, as well as a certificate commemorating Mary Vandeven's first communion.
