Historical Note:

New Madrid, Missouri was founded in 1789 by George Morgan of New Jersey on the site of a French-Canadian trading post and considers itself to be the first American town west of the Mississippi River. The New Madrid Chamber of Commerce was organized at the Claire Coffee Shop in New Madrid on July 7, 1954, to promote commercial growth among all business owners. The organization followed the disbandment of the Junior Chamber of Commerce which was founded by ten young businessmen on August 17, 1937. The move reflected a desire to unite all business leaders, regardless of age.

The New Madrid Chamber of Commerce later incorporated on October 15, 1958 "for the primary purpose of engaging in a long range and sustained effort to attract industry and to promote industrial growth in New Madrid and the surrounding territory." The group proved to be successful at recruiting Noranda Aluminum Inc. to locate in New Madrid, and the community managed to secure a \$210 million special revenue bond in 1968 to construct the St. Jude Industrial Park and a steam generating power plant to accommodate the new industry.

The promotional photographs were taken during the 1970s, 1980s and 1990s, and the earliest photographs reflect the period of industrial expansion following the construction of the Noranda aluminum reduction plant in 1968. The collection of photographs features the agricultural, industrial, cultural and historical assets of New Madrid.

The New Madrid Chamber of Commerce was dissolved by the Missouri Secretary of State in 2022.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged into a single series.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection consists of 58 photographs taken in New Madrid, Missouri, during the 1970s, 1980s, and 1990s. The photographs depict agriculture, industry, church buildings, commercial buildings, historic buildings, museum buildings, residential buildings, school buildings and heritage tourism in New Madrid.
