Abstract: This collection consists of multiple sets of photographs and some paper materials, dating from approximately the end of the 1800s through the mid-1900s. The majority of the labeled photographs depict the lives of Jasper and Edith (Jacob) Janes and their three children: Doris Sue, Thomas Maurice, and Cosbert Janes. More than half of the photographs are unlabeled.

Historical Note:

Jasper Lee Janes (1886-1957) was born October 23rd, 1886, to Isaac W. Janes and Elizabeth Caroline (Owens) Janes, on the Janes family farm near Leora in Stoddard County, Missouri. On February 4, 1911, he married Edith Jacobs (1891-1970). Together they had three children: Cosbert Earl (1912-1927), Thomas Maurice (1914-1951), and Doris Sue (1921-1960). He passed in 1957 and is buried in Oak Ridge Cemetery (Kennet, Missouri.)

Edith Jacobs (1891-1970) was born January 23rd, 1891, to William J. Jacobs and Ella Jane "Jennie" (Kick) Jacobs, in Jackson County, Illinois. By 1910 her family had moved to Kennet in Dunklin County, Missouri, where her father William worked as a water pumper for the railroad; Edith was working as a house-worker when she married Jasper Lee Janes in 1911. After her marriage, she worked for several decades as a seamstress. She outlived her husband and all three of their children; she passed in 1970 and is buried in Oak Ridge Cemetery.

Cosbert Janes, the oldest of their three children, passed away as a freshman in high school from meningitis. Thomas Maurice entered the National Guard in 1936, and later served with the U.S. Army during World War II. He married Marcella Diebold in 1942, and together they had one daughter, Maria Sue Janes. He passed in 1951 and is buried in Arlington National Cemetery. Doris Sue graduated with a degree in nursing in 1942. Her lifelong friend Maxine Stout is also featured regularly in the pictures of Doris Sue as a young woman. Doris Sue married Ralph L. Ray in 1946; they had no children and later divorced. She passed in 1960 and is buried in Kennett, Missouri, in the Oak Ridge Cemetery along with her parents and oldest brother Cosbert.

Scope and Content Note:

Papers

This series contains materials related to the personal and academic papers of members of the Janes family. There is schoolwork from Doris Sue and Cosbert; correspondence and postcards to Jasper and Edith, both before they were married as well as after they became a couple; a certificate for Jasper Lee for his excellence in war production by his work at the Pine Bluff Arsenal; two visitor passes for U.S. Congressional buildings and a Valentine's Day card to Maria Sue; and an article about the investigation into the death of Thomas Maurice, who died from drinking poisonous wood alcohol. The dates in this series range from 1909 to 1960; folders have been arranged in alphabetical order.

Photographs

This series consists of photographs of members of the Janes and Jacobs families. The listed dates in this series range from 1931 to 1969; however, some of the photographs appear to have been

taken much earlier than 1931, from around the late 19th century through the first part of the 20th century. More than half of the photos are not labeled, and the majority are undated. The folders have been arranged in alphabetical order.
