Historical Note:

Born in Richmond, Ray County, Missouri, Thomas Allen Brady (1902-1964) received his B.A. from the University of Missouri in 1924 and his M.A. and Ph.D. from Harvard University in 1926 and 1931, respectively. He was an instructor at the University of Missouri from 1926-1929 and then an assistant professor and professor from 1930 to 1946. Within that time, he became the first University of Missouri faculty member to be awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship, a prestigious grant to further scholarly development and research, in 1936. His publications as a historian of classics include *The Reception of Egyptian Cults by the Greeks 330-30 B.C.* (1935) and *The Gymnasium in Ptolemaic Egypt* (1936).

Soon thereafter he married Mary Elizabeth Leslie. In 1946 he became the Vice President in Charge of Extra-Divisional Educational Activities, a position later renamed Dean of Extra-Divisional Administration in 1955. Throughout his tenure he created counseling and vocational programs for WWII veterans and expanded student services and degree programs. He retired from the position in 1964 and died shortly thereafter in Columbia. In 1966, the University of Missouri Board of Curators chose Brady as the namesake for the new student center that had been completed in 1963.

Scope and Content Note:

The material found within this collection was donated on three separate dates. The staff members at the time processed each addition separately, starting the folders for each new addition at folder one. The dates accompanying the series titles can be found on the folders and can help to distinguish between series. The final series, **Miscellaneous Papers (1937-1957)** was originally processed as two separate groups, **1937-1941** and **1955-1957**, each beginning at folder one. They have been combined into one series and the folder labels reflect their new folder numbers.

Medical School (1910-1959)

This series contains papers collected by Brady regarding the establishment of a four year medical school. The typed copies and photostats in this collection were deposited in that form by Brady. In most cases the originals were not included in the material that he deposited in the collection.

Missouri School of Mines (1942-1952)

This series contains papers collected by Brady regarding the Missouri School of Mines. Note: the typed copies and photostats in this collection were deposited in that form by Dr. Brady. In most cases, the originals were not included in the material that Dr. Brady deposited in the collection.

Administrative (1944-1952)

This series contains administrative correspondence and papers of Thomas A. Brady. Most of the correspondence is with educators and administrators. The greater part of the material was collected during the period when Brady was Vice President in charge of Extra-Divisional Affairs. Some of the material is from an earlier period when he was Professor of History and Director of Veterans Services at the University of Missouri.

Miscellaneous Papers (1937-1957)

This series contains miscellaneous papers of Dean Thomas A. Brady. Papers were collected while Brady was a member of the History Department at the University of Missouri. Also includes minutes of History Department faculty meetings. List of persons receiving advanced degrees in history (1941) including thesis topics. Schedule of history courses to be offered in the fall of 1941. Also includes legislative budget data, speeches, and material from various schools at the University of Missouri.
