Abstract: Correspondence, bills, receipts, clippings, pamphlets, and church supply catalogues of a minister of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South. Dillman held pastorates in St. Louis, where he was engaged in settlement house work; Berwyn, Nebraska; and several towns in southwest Missouri. Papers are from the St. Louis and southwest periods of his ministry.

Historical Note:

Samuel Rodgers Dillman was born in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, on May 5, 1874. He was ordained as an elder by the United Brethren Church at Oregon, Pennsylvania. He was licensed by the United Brethren at Trenton, Missouri, April 9, 1894, and admitted to the Missouri Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, on September 16, 1900.

Dillman attended high school in Illinois; Avalon College, Trenton, Missouri; Northeast Missouri State College, Kirksville; and Washington University, St. Louis. He married Daisy Dean Drinkard.

Before 1911, Dillman held pastorates at Brookfield, Trenton, Brashear, Raymore, Hunnewell, and Monticello, Missouri. From 1911 to 1913, he was pastor of Kingdom House, a settlement house of the Methodist Church in St. Louis. From this position, he was transferred to Bellefontaine Methodist Church in the St. Louis suburbs.

During World War I, Dillman apparently left the ministry and resided around Saratoga, Wyoming. Sometime in 1920 he south admittance to a Methodist Conference and was admitted to the Eastern Nebraska with a pastorate at Berwyn. While at Berwyn, he sought admittance to the Missouri Conference and was admitted to the Southwest Missouri Conference. He held pastorates in Montrose, Chilhowee, Appleton City, and Eldorado Springs among other places. He retired and lived in or near Trenton, Missouri, after 1945.
