Robert Kirk Brady was born in Richmond, Missouri, on August 16, 1894. He served in World War I with the 140<sup>th</sup> Infantry. He was engaged in the real estate and insurance business with his father, Durwood B. Brady. Robert died on September 8, 1941, in Jefferson City, Missouri.
