Historical Note:

Dwight H. Brown was born on January 12, 1887, in Benton, Missouri. At the age of nine, the family moved to Poplar Bluff. He became the editor of the *Citizen Democrat* and for 22 years was engaged in the newspaper business before getting into politics. In 1924 Brown became a Missouri senator. In 1932 he was elected Missouri Secretary of State and serviced until 1944. Brown also served as director of the Southeast Missouri Agricultural Bureau for eight years and was vice-president of the Missouri Democratic Press Association. He served five years as the president of the Missouri Chamber of Commerce. He had hopes of running for governor when he died on May 8, 1944. Brown married Katherine Arrendale in 1929.
