Historical Note:

William Henry Dulany was born in what is now Howard County, Missouri, on January 9, 1818, to Joseph Stanton Dulany and Sarah Maupin. He married Susan Isabelle Van Zant in 1848 and their children included Mary Thomas, Daniel M. Jr., George W., and Susan Isabelle. After the death of his first wife, William H. Dulany remarried to Mrs. Talitha C. Bodine, the daughter of Rev. Anderson Woods. Together they had a son, James G. Dulany.

After the Civil War, William H. Dulany purchased land in Randolph County, Missouri, and established a lumber business with his brother Daniel Maupin Dulany and J.H. McVeigh. His son George W., and grandson George W. Jr., were also involved in the lumber business.

William Henry Dulany died in Hannibal, Missouri, on March 4, 1914.
