### **Historical Note:**

Nathaniel Lyon was born on July 14, 1818, in Ashford, Connecticut, to Amasa and Kezia Knowlton Lyon, the seventh of nine children. He was a Union general during the American Civil War. On August 10, 1861, Lyon was shot and killed during the battle at Wilson's Creek near Springfield, Missouri.
