**Abstract:** Correspondence to wife while on duty with Missouri State Militia during the Civil War; encounters with guerrilla forces; battle descriptions; and personal relations with fellow soldiers. Also letter to wife from California gold fields, 1851; letters about his dismissal from job with Railway Mail Service; and letters about his Civil War pension claim.

#### **Biographical Note:**

Bazel F. Lazear (1823-1894) served as a Lt. Col. in the Missouri State Militia from 1861 to 1865. After the war he was a postal clerk at least 10 years with the Railway Mail Service and finally retired as postmaster of Auxvasse, Missouri.

#### **Arrangement:**

The collection has been arranged chronologically.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

The collection contains letters from Lazear to his wife from the California gold fields, 1851, and Civil War letters to his wife, relating to battles and encounters with Confederate guerrillas. Later, letters related to his employment with the Railway Mail Service, position of postmaster of Auxvasse, Missouri, Civil War pension claims, and a request for battle sketches for a book. More complete folder descriptions are located in the container list.
