Biographical Note:

Paul Paquin was born in Montreal, Canada, on June 22, 1860. He received a degree in medicine from McGill University and then came to the University of Missouri. In 1886 he went to Europe

to study with renown scientists there such as Pasteur and Latteux. He returned to Missouri to become a professor of histology in the School of Medicine. Pauqin became Missouri's first state veterinarian and later he was the director of health in Kansas City. Paquin died on June 23, 1916, of tubercular meningitis.

directing their attention to diseased animals throughout Missouri,		
the quarantine regulations governing animals with contagious		
diseases and the inspection of the major stockyards. Letters from		
stock raisers requesting information on available cures for		
different animal diseases. Information pertaining to the use of		
crude oil in the treatment of hog cholera. Includes numerous		
descriptions of Texas Fever and glanders symptoms as well as		
other diseases as reported by stock-raisers. Role of Veterinary		
Act of 1889 in quarantine and killing of certain diseased		
animals and compensation to owners.		
Pamphlets and circulars contain information pertaining to		
quarantine regulations governing the transportation of Southern		
cattle; a copy of Governor D.R. Francis' Quarantine		
Proclamation of March 27, 1891, for Missouri which gives		
directions for handling Southern cattle and for disinfecting areas		
in which these cattle are kept. Includes a map of a		
stockyard.
