Historical Note:

William Wilson Hampshire (1840-1895) was born in Indiana, but by the time of the Civil War he was living in Missouri. During the Civil War he served with Company C, 23rd Missouri Infantry.

The author of this history was the son of William Wilson Hampshire and his wife, Mary Ellen Taylor (1843-1906). Albert D. Hampshire (1884-1965) was born in Mercer County, Missouri. In 1910 he married Bertie Cummins, and they had three daughters: Pauline Hampshire Dougherty (1913-2003), Shirley Jean Hampshire Courtney Schumaker (1926-1998), and Billie Jo Hampshire Gault (1934-1977). He worked as a railroad conductor.
