# **Biographical Note:**

George Kuemmel was born in Germany and immigrated to America in 1861 and settled in Howard County, Missouri. He married Natalie Wagner Kuemmel and the couple had a daughter, Cornelia Kuemmel, who became a talented painter. They also had one son, George Frederick Kuemmel. Kuemmel taught music at Hardin College and Conservatory of Music in Mexico, Missouri, and at Pritchett College in Glasgow, Missouri. He was also involved in the Missouri Freemasons.
