Biographical Note:

William Kuemmel was born in Germany in 1842. He came to the United States in the 1850s. By the time the Civil War started, he had settled in Missouri. During the Civil War, he joined the Union and fought for the 18th Missouri Infantry. In June 1874 he married Lina Pfeiffer (1852-1942). They had a daughter Elle Kuemmel (1875-1892). Besides the general merchandise firm, he worked as a watchmaker. He died November 20, 1927 in St. Louis.
