He began his career as an associate librarian for the *Philadelphia Public Ledger*. During World War II, he was with the Still Picture Library, Army Pictorial Service and after his discharge, he became the librarian for the Louisville *Times* and *Courier-Journal*. He retired in 1963 but continued his interest in newspaper libraries both as an author and lecturer.
