Historical Note:

The Missouri Association for Social Welfare (MASW) was organized in 1901 as the Missouri Conference of Charities and Corrections and renamed the Missouri Conference for Social Welfare in 1915. The present name was adopted in 1934.

The objects and purposes of the MASW are to improve and extend the health and welfare of the people of the State of Missouri, and to promote the improvement of public and private social services and the prevention of poverty, crime, and disease in the State of Missouri. Its purpose may be accomplished through: research; education, including conferences and institutes; social planning; community organization; and cooperation with public and private agencies.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged alphabetically by topic.

Scope and Content Note:

The MASW Records consist of correspondence, minutes, committee records, membership lists, background material on legislation, newsletters, treasurers' reports, and conference materials.
