**Abstract:** The papers of Charles Claude Guthrie, Sr. contain college essays and notes, correspondence, and miscellaneous personal papers of Guthrie. The bulk of the collection is letters written between Guthrie and his mother and sisters living in Columbia and Marthasville, Missouri.

## **Biographical Note:**

Charles Claude Guthrie was born May 13, 1880, the fourth of five children of Robert McCluer and Fannie Hall Guthrie. The family lived in Gilmore, Missouri, until 1899, when the family moved to Columbia, Missouri. In 1904 Guthrie married Maude Glidden Walker and in 1907, their son, Charles Claude Guthrie, Jr., was born.

Guthrie was a physician, professor of physiology, inventor and pioneer researcher in the field of vascular surgery with Alexis Carrel. He received his B.S. degree from Woodlawn Institute in 1896. In 1902 he graduated from the University of Missouri School of Medicine. From 1902 until 1903, Guthrie worked as a demonstrator in physiology at Western Reserve University. In 1903, he accepted a position as instructor in physiology at the University of Chicago. He left there in 1907 to become a professor of physiology and pharmacology at Washington University, St. Louis. In the fall of 1909, Guthrie went to the University of Pittsburgh as professor of physiology and pharmacology and pharmacology and the University of Pittsburgh as the University of Pittsburgh until his retirement in 1950.

Guthrie died June 16, 1963, and is buried in Columbia, Missouri.
