Abstract: The collection contains items from the Bezold family of Montgomery and Gasconade Counties in Missouri. There are many school-related items from 1879-1917. Also included are sermons in German by Reverend Niedhammer and a family history of John Jacob Meunzenmayer, who lived in Franklin County.

Historical Note:

Arthur A. Schweighauser (1908-1990) was a Hermann, Missouri, historian who was known for restoring the Klenk house in Hermann—the ancestral home of his wife, Julia M. Schweighauser (1908-1995). The Klenk house was built in 1846 by Julia's great-grandfather, Mathias Klenk (1819-). It is on the list of national historic sites and was open for more than twenty years for tours. Julia's mother, Louise Klenk (1880-), married Charles G. Bezold (1871-1914), in 1903. G. Adam Bezold, the great-grandfather of Julia Schweighauser, was a furniture designer in Germany who hoped to make a living making fine furniture in Hermann, Missouri.

Arrangement:

The collection has been arranged chronologically by type of material.

Scope and Content Note:

This collection contains miscellaneous materials documenting German families in the Hermann, Missouri, area, and includes a book of folk remedies in German from 1713; drawings of furniture by G. Adam Bezold from the 1820s; two sermon books in German by Reverend Niedhammer, 1869-1905; and the family history of John Jacob Muenzenmayer (1832-1918). Also included is one German carpenter book showing drawings of German construction methods.

The science journal within these papers was written by Julia's mother, Louise Klenk (1880-). The 1879 Hermann School report cards of Charles's brother, Fritz, are in these papers. Charles' niece, Elma Bezold's (1896-), report cards, autograph books, and drawing book comprise much of these papers. The shop transaction registry in this collection belonged to Charles' nephew, William A. Bezold (1893-1971), who, according to the 1920 McKittrick Census, was a harness maker who owned his own shop. The obituary scrapbook contains obituaries of many Bezold family members as well as other residents and former residents of Gasconade and Montgomery counties.
