Abstract: The Missouri Collection is an artificial collection combining miscellaneous small acquisitions related to Missouri places, individuals, organizations, and events.

Collection Size: 18.6 cubic feet, 37 oversize items, 9 audio cassettes, 7 audio discs, 9 CDs, 1 computer disc, 8 reels of film, 6 film strips, 9 DVDs, 3 video cassettes, 585 MB of digital files (859 folders, 923 photographs)

Language: Collection materials are mostly in English. Some documents written in German are included.
