### **Historical Note:**

The club was organized in 1914 at the home of Vaneta Hackedorn. She had asked several women to come to her home for the possibility of organizing a club. The first record of dues paid was for the years 1917-1918. After the flu epidemic in 1918 and World War I, the club resumed its activities. Among the activities the club participated in were dinners, talks, social programs, parties, and assisting in various charitable events. The club membership remained relatively small, with frequent turnover, but continued to be active until 1986, when the club was officially disbanded. However, the club continued to exist in some form until at least 1992.

## **Scope and Content Note:**

The **Histories** series contains a narrative history of the club from its original formation in 1914 to 1992.

The **Meeting Minutes** series also contain the club's original and revised version of its constitution and by-laws, along with meeting minutes for the years 1919-1986. There is no existing record for the years 1914-1918, partially due to the First World War and the Flu Epidemic.

The **Miscellaneous Material** series contain information on club officers and programs, newsletters, and some Fortnightly Club programs and newsletters, 1967-1973.
