INTRODUCTION

Account books of Dr. William S. Campbell of Albany, Missouri; medical student's notebook, University of Louisville, 1855-1856; two volumes of *Physician's Record of Prescriptions*, concerning prescribing intoxicating liquors, 1924-1925; *Physician's Daily Visiting List and Record*, 1927; Jenkins P. Robertson's personal account book, 1847; D.A.R. correspondence, diplomas, and miscellany, 1930-1932.

DONOR INFORMATION

The records were donated to the State Historical Society of Missouri by Dr. John F. Patton on 27 April 1983 (Accession No. 2473). An addition was made on 29 July 1983 by Dr. John F. Patton (Accession No. 2484).

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The University of Louisville medical student's notebook contains notes taken from a program of Medical Department lectures, 1855-1856 and the small account book belonging to Jenkins P. Robinson lists goods and services provided and fees paid in 1847.

The other account books contain daily entries of patients seen by Dr. William S. Campbell of Albany, Missouri. They consist of the patient's name, often listing fees collected. Also included in most of the account books is *Warner's Calendar of Medical History, For the Use of the Medical Profession*, listing names of early pioneers in the field of medicine, and describing early medical discoveries and procedures. There are sections dedicated to treatment and symptoms of poisoning, incompatibilities of drugs, standard height and weight measurements for men and women, as well as respiratory and pulmonary averages, etc., and other medical related topics.

Also included are some advertisements for medications, 1927-1937, and two record books, *Physician's Record of Prescriptions*, issued by the Treasury Department of the United States Internal Revenue, National Prohibition Act, Form 1402, listing serial number entry, date of issue, name and address of patient, quantity and kind of liquor prescribed, particular ailment, and directions and/or amount for use. The record books were used to record the prescription of intoxicating liquors, 1924, 1925.

The other portion of this collection contains various D.A.R. (Daughters of the American Revolution), chapters, such as Bowling Green, Columbia, Cooper County and Pilot Grove, and consist of correspondence regarding the writing of a book on member's maternal ancestors. Letters to and from the chapters, as well as the Kansas City branch of the *National League of American Pen Women*, the *Southeast Missouri State Teachers College*, as well as different individuals, 1930, 1932. Additional D.A.R. correspondence includes a letter written to a Mrs. Mary Asbury McKay, Columbia, Missouri, from Jessie Berry Collins, Butler, Missouri, March 21, 1932. The letter concerns a writing of the history of Harmony Mission and Jane Montgomery Warrick Maddox, taken from available sources.

Folders are arranged in alphabetical order by subject, and chronologically within each subject.
