Biographical Note:

T. (Thomas) Clifford Morgan was born on March 4, 1919, near Preston, Missouri, to Thomas W. and Odessa Walker Morgan. He served in the Civilian Conservation Corps from 1936 to 1938, and in the Navy during World War II from 1942 to 1945. He married Elizabeth Jean Nelson in

1949. He conducted genealogical research on both his own family and Elizabeth's. He was most known for his work with the Kyger and Morgan families. Thomas died in 2009.

Elizabeth Jean Nelson was born to Alfred Nelson and Mabel Wilson near Paola, Kansas, in 1926. She received a teaching degree in Iowa and taught kindergarten and church classes for much of her life. She was involved in Missouri 4-H in Platte and Benton Counties and founded the Damsite Dancers Square Dance Club with her husband in Warsaw, Missouri. She and Thomas had two children: Kathryn and Thomas. Elizabeth died in 2015.

Scope and Content Note:

Genealogy

This series contains the genealogy papers of Elizabeth Jean (Nelson) Morgan. It consists of a journal, a scrapbook, and the ancestral tree of Elizabeth Jean Morgan. The journal was written by one of Elizabeth's family members, Mary Kaucher, about her trip out west with her family. The scrapbook consists of family records of several family groups, including the Millers, Kauchers, and Bruners. The ancestral tree covers the lineage of Ester Bruner, Elizabeth's father's second wife.

Documents

This series consists of miscellaneous pamphlets, an I.O.O.F Ledger dated from 1856 to 1902, and a book titled *Summary of Advantages offered to Emigrants and Capitalists* by Corydon F. Craig from 1880. There is evidence that the Kaucher family may have had some members in the I.O.O.F during the time frame listed in the ledger.
