### Biographical Note:

During the Civil War, William H. Smith served as captain of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Missouri Infantry from 1862-1863. Later, he was promoted to lieutenant colonel by Missouri Confederate Governor Thomas C. Reynolds in 1864. With this promotion, he served as Superintendent of Army Records for Francis M. Cockrell's First Missouri Brigade in Columbus, Georgia from 1864-1865.

**Arrangement:**

This collection has been arranged chronologically.

**Scope and Content Note:**

The collection contains 33 letters from family, friends, and military commanders to William H. Smith during his service in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Missouri Infantry as captain and lieutenant colonel. Smith served as sutler and Superintendent of Army Records in Columbus, Georgia from 1864-1865. Smith's relatives and friends write to him from Mississippi and Alabama while Smith is serving in Mississippi. The letters provide a glimpse into the daily life and living conditions of citizens during the latter part of the Civil War.

In folder four there are lists of soldiers in Company I and D of the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Missouri Cavalry (Confederate) and Company D 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Missouri Infantry (Confederate). The lists provide what supplies the soldiers requested and costs of the item. For the men of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Missouri, written in pencil, is what happened to them, death, prisoner, or paid.
