Historical Note:

The parents of the donor are Norma Jean Sims and Robert (Bob) Hardy Hackett. Norma was born in Staples, Minnesota, in 1925 and died on September 27, 2016. During her life, she earned a masters in counseling at the University of Minnesota and was active in several feminist organizations. Robert Hardy Hackett was born in 1926 and died on March 9, 2006, in Edina, Minnesota. The couple had three children: Dave, Robyn, and Scott. Dave graduated from Macalester College in 1969 and eventually moved to Gays Mills, Wisconsin, with his partner Ellen Brooks, a Columbia, Missouri, native. Robyn married Steve Dentinger and had two children, Taryn and Bryn, in Duluth, Minnesota. Scott remained with his parents for several years, staying with Norma after Robert and Norma's divorce in 1978. Robert and Norma's divorce and its consequences are a major topic discussed in the letters.
