Abstract: Correspondence, photographs, wills, military records, leases, contracts, and miscellaneous material of the Kirby, Ridgway, Lightholder, and related families. The papers document the lives of a Quaker family from Shelltown, New Jersey, and the life of Col. Ellwood Kirby, who moved westward to Missouri.

Historical Note:

The Kirby-Ridgway-Lightholder family papers represents the story of a New Jersey family who eventually had members move west to Missouri and then further west to the state of California. James and Maria Kirby were Quaker farmers living in Shelltown, New Jersey, during the 1800s. Their children were Robert, Mary, Anna, Edgar, Henry, and Ellwood.

The majority of the papers pertain to Ellwood Kirby, born in 1830, and later known as Col. Ellwood Kirby. He followed his brother Robert to Philadelphia and in 1850 was a bricklayer. By 1860, he had moved to Forest City, Missouri, in Holt County, and had become a civil engineer, mostly working on bridges. He enlisted in the Civil War in Buchanan County and was commissioned as a major and then lieutenant colonel for the 48th Regiment, Missouri Infantry Volunteers. After the war, Ellwood moved from St. Joseph, Missouri, to Jefferson City, and changed careers once again to work for the *Missouri State Times*. In 1867, he was commissioned by Governor Thomas Fletcher to be the Missouri State Printer.

While working for the paper in Jefferson City, Ellwood began courting Florence Ridgway in St. Louis. Florence was born on April 15, 1846, in Wayne County, Illinois, to Caleb and Jane Ridgway. This relationship unfolds throughout the correspondence. On April 15, 1868, the two married and settled down in Jefferson City. By 1878, the family moved to St. Louis and Ellwood became the editor of the *Globe Democrat*, covering legislative affairs for the newspaper. Ellwood and Florence had four children: Anna (who died at the age of four in 1874), Ella, Robert, and Ellwood. Col. Ellwood Kirby was involved in an accident on July 5, 1881, and he succumbed to his injuries on July 18. A daughter, named Ellwood, after her father, was born after his death on September 24, 1881. After her husband's death, Florence made ends meet by renting rooms to boarders.

Ellwood Kirby grew up in St. Louis and attended the Sacred Heart Convent in St. Charles, Missouri. She married Joseph Lightholder on March 23, 1905. By 1910, Ellwood, Joseph, and Florence were living in Los Angeles, California. Ellwood and Joseph had two sons, Ellwood and Ridgway. Florence lived with her daughter until her death on February 10, 1926. Joseph Lightholder was born on July 25, 1879, in St. Louis. After moving his family to California, he became a salesman. He died on August 24, 1952, and Ellwood, his wife, died on June 9, 1968.

Scope and Content Note:

Correspondence

The Correspondence series includes letters to Ellwood Kirby in Missouri from his family in Shelltown, New Jersey. The letters include information about the family and opinions about the Civil War, including President Lincoln's assassination. By 1867 the letters are largely written by Ellwood Kirby to Florence Ridgway in St. Louis during the courting phase of their relationship. He repeatedly expresses his feelings for her and talks about his life in Jefferson City, the people he visits with, and his work for the *Missouri State Times*. Many letters were written to Florence to express condolences regarding the death of Ellwood Kirby in July of 1881. Later letters are to and from Florence and her children Robert "Bob" and Ellwood "Woody."

Family Papers

The Family Papers series includes the legal and personal papers documenting the lives of the Kirby, Ridgway, and Lightholder families, including military commissions earned by Ellwood Kirby and his business agreements, deeds, leases, and insurance policies of different Kirby family members; baptismal records, death records, wills, and marriage records of the Lightholder family, including the citizenship record of James Lightholder in 1867; the will of Caleb I. Ridgway; and records pertaining to Ellwood "Woody" and Joe Lightholder.

Genealogy

This series consists of genealogical information compiled by the Kirby, Ridgway, and Lightholder families such as family charts, census indexes, notes, correspondence between family members, printouts of Ancestry family lists, and a photocopy of *Lightholder of Ireland and America*. Also included is a folder of miscellaneous obituaries; wedding announcements and calling cards; Woody's illustrated envelopes sent to her husband, Joe Lightholder, 1902-1904; two diaries of Ellwood Kirby; and three recipe books of Florence Kirby, dated 1863-1875. The Ellwood Kirby diaries document some of his professional life and some of his personal musings, but are not in-depth writings.

Photographs

The Photograph series includes a wide range of images of the Kirby, Ridgway, and Lightholder families along with photographs of their extended families. The photograph series contains examples of a wide range of photographic formats. The bulk of the images are from the 1860s and 1870s when the carte de visite, or visiting card, was very popular to hand out to friends and relatives. Also included are cabinet cards, popular in the 1880s and simply a large version of the carte de visite, and tin types. Of special interest is a series of Civil War portraits of unidentified soldiers in uniform.

Scrapbook

The Scrapbook series contains one scrapbook created by Delia Ridgway, the sister of Florence Ridgway Kirby, and contains newspaper clippings of poetry and some engravings. It is undated.

Artifacts

The Artifacts series contains memorabilia kept by Ellwood Kirby.

Oversize

The Oversize series contains records kept by Col. Ellwood Kirby, as well as Ella Kirby's certificate of scholarship in 1890. The bulk of the series pertains to Kirby's muster in and out rolls during his time in the Civil War, plus his commissions to major and lieutenant colonel.
