**Abstract:** The personal and political papers of a Republican U. S. Representative from Missouri's seventh congressional district include education and personal papers; correspondence; campaign materials; speeches; press releases; audiovisual material; photographs; subject files; and committee records. Includes materials on Table Rock Dam and Reservoir and the U. S. Army during World War II and the Cold War.

**Biographical Note:**

Dewey Jackson Short, the famed “Orator of the Ozarks,” was born on April 7, 1898, in Galena, Missouri, to Jackson Grant Short and Permelia Cordelia Short. The seventh of ten children, Short was a small-town boy who exhibited oratory skills at an early age. Short began working early, which enabled him to open a savings account to pay for his college education. He greatly valued education, and obtained three degrees; first, at Marionville College in Marionville, Missouri, second, at Baker University in Baldwin, Kansas, and third, a Master’s in Theology at Boston University.

As a college educated World War I veteran, Short would turn his attention to world travel, where he spent time on an Oxford and Heidelberg education. Returning to the U.S. in 1923, he began preaching, where he was in high demand in his community. Short accepted a professor job in 1925 at Southwestern College in Winfield, Kansas, before enrolling in law school at Harvard University. Between 1925-1927, Short began seriously contemplating a run for the U.S. House of Representatives for the 14<sup>th</sup> district of Missouri.

In 1928, Short campaigned to serve in the U.S House for the 71<sup>st</sup> congress, 1929-1931. He was elected and served twenty-four years as representative of the 14th and then the 7th District of Missouri. In 1932, Representative Short lost his re-election campaign, like many members of the GOP, due to the Great Depression, Franklin Delano Roosevelt, and New Deal democrats. Following this campaign, Short lost a U.S Senate race in 1932 but was re-elected to the House in 1934 to serve in ten consecutive congresses from 1935-1957. Short was a staunch anti-New Deal policy Republican, and famously voted “no” on all New Deal legislation, barring only Social Security and federal funding for Table Rock Dam, a project that would end up being his most notable accomplishment. During the 84<sup>th</sup> Congress, Dewey Short married Helen Gladys Hughes on April 20, 1937.

Short was a long-standing member of the Military Affairs Committee, renamed the Armed Services Committee in 1947. Representative Short eventually served as the chair for the committee during the 83<sup>rd</sup> congress, 1953-1955. Flood control was an issue Short began pursuing in 1929, believing that the value to his native Missouri and his constituents was something that could be beneficial for generations. The Table Rock Dam project was gaining support during the latter part of the 1930s and was well on its way to becoming a reality when Pearl Harbor was attacked on December 7, 1941, shifting the nation’s needs and goals to support the war effort. Flood control was an issue the Armed Services Committee put on the backburner until 1945 when the war ended. Construction began on Table Rock Dam in 1954 and was completed in 1958. Short’s influence and staunch support of the dam culminated in the visitor center being named after the congressman in 1959.

In 1956, Dewey Short lost his final re-election bid to Charles H. Brown, but his career in politics was not yet complete. President Dwight D. Eisenhower appointed Short as Assistant Secretary of the Army, a position he held from 1957-1961. Dewey Short's gift for oratory followed him his whole life, and his epitaph included, "Orator of the Ozarks." Dewey Jackson Short died on November 19, 1979, and is buried in his hometown of Galena, Missouri.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

#### **Personal series**

The personal series is arranged chronologically dating from 1912 to 1980. This series contains personal correspondence to and from Dewey Short, beginning with his early life in 1912 and ending in 1925 prior to his first congressional campaign. The letters cover his life as a young man in Galena, Missouri, receiving his first job at the People's Ice Company at the age of 12, his preparation for college, financial worries, his participation in World War I, pursuance of his college degrees, theological concepts, his first job in the ministry as an Episcopalian minister in Kansas, and his travels around the world to Europe, Russia, India, Egypt, and Germany. The series contains travel documents such as passports, receipts, menus from hotels and cruise ships, guidebooks, and brochures from all over the world. Also included in these files are class notes from his time as a college student and a professor at Baker University, along with notebooks filled with Dewey's personal notes and his bank books from his early life.

This series also consists of some personal files from his life in politics including daily calendars from 1938 to 1960, along with correspondence regarding a medical operation in January of 1955, birthday wishes and cards from his friends, family, constituents, colleagues, and government officials throughout his years in politics. The series wraps up with personal photographs of

Dewey, his wife Helen, his brothers, sisters, and parents. The photographs document Dewey's life inside and outside of politics including his travels around the world.

### **Campaign series**

The Campaign series dates from 1928 to 1968 and is arranged chronologically. The records contain letters to and from Dewey Short pertaining to the upcoming primaries and general elections and include letters of support, concern over legislative matters and bills put forward in Congress, as well as logistical and financial matters pertaining to the campaigns, information regarding opposition research, some speeches, flyers, handbills, and letters of criticism for both the Republican and Democratic parties, and propaganda. Also included are files of congratulatory letters and telegrams, Declaration of Candidacy for election years, including financial donors. Of special interest is a file regarding concerns over the Selective Service Act of 1946 and a file pertaining to Dewey Short's nomination for the vice-presidency in 1940. The Campaign series demonstrates how Dewey Short's political network in southwest Missouri functioned, specifically the work of local Republican Committee groups, his staff, and friends and family.

### **Congressional series**

The Congressional series contains ten sub-series with records collected by Dewey Short and his secretaries during the 71<sup>st</sup> & 74<sup>th</sup>-84<sup>th</sup> Congresses. This includes publications, research, correspondence and ephemera with a focus on Missouri's 7<sup>th</sup> Congressional district, veteran affairs, domestic policy, the Republican Party and the Armed Services Committee.

#### **Press Releases sub-series**

This series contains press releases of Dewey Short's speeches and comments regarding the important issues to Dewey and the Republican party of their time and his various activities and travels as a congressman. This series is arranged chronologically by year beginning in 1938 and goes up through to 1956. The press releases contained in this series originate from Short's congressional office, his campaign headquarters, radio stations and news sources. The texts of his speeches and comments range from his disapproval of FDR and the New Deal, his support for veterans and Missouri agriculture recovery from the effects of the Great Depression, his support of various members of the Republican party such as President Eisenhower and Senator Richard Nixon, the outrage over the ninety percent income tax on the super-rich under President Eisenhower, and anti-communism rhetoric.

#### **Speeches sub-series**

The speeches series primarily consists of political speeches, arranged chronologically that Dewey gave throughout his career in Congress beginning in the latter part of the 1920s up through to his time as Assistant Secretary of the Army at the end of the 1950s. Also included in this series are sermons Dewey gave as an Episcopalian minister in the mid-1920s prior to his career in politics. The content of these speeches was dependent upon the issues the country and Missourians were facing at certain times such as the Great Depression throughout the 1930s, the attack on Pearl Harbor, World War II, military affairs and defense, the Korean conflict, and the Communist threat. Many of his speeches were in support of the GOP platform and his personal views on topics like the New Deal, Social Security and the care of our elderly, veterans' affairs, the democratic party, and their elected officials. One overlaying topic of interest beginning in the

late 1920s and of great importance to Dewey was the issue of flood control and the pursuance of the Table Rock Dam project located outside of Branson, Missouri, on the White River.

### **Invitations to Speak** sub-series

This sub-series is comprised of invitations to Dewey Short for speaking engagements and appearances from around the country. The sub-series is arranged in chronological order dated 1954 to 1956 apart from invitations specific to banquets such as the Lincoln Day Banquet to which Dewey often accepted. It is important to note that this series is comprised of a mix of accepted, unaccepted, and unknown status of the attendance of Dewey to the event.

### **Personal/Political Correspondence** sub-series

This series contains the personal and political letters to and from Dewey Short, arranged chronologically from 1926 to 1979. The letters are comprised of both personal and political letters, with very little constituent correspondence. The personal letters are to and from Dewey from his friends and family members, most notably his wife Helen Hughes Short, his sister and one of his closest advisors Bess Allman, his father Jackson Grant Short, his brothers Charlie, W.B., Leonard, and Joe Short. The political correspondence includes letters to and from Dewey from congressional colleagues like Joe J. Manlove and Clarence Cannon both from Missouri, former and potential members of congress like O.K. Armstrong, government officials and other politicians such as Governor Samuel A. Baker from Missouri, Vice-President Richard Nixon, Presidents Herbert Hoover, Franklin Roosevelt, Harry Truman, and Dwight Eisenhower.

The letters cover a wide array of topics including thank you letters for gifts such as football tickets and bacon from politicians like Richard Nixon. The political correspondence is primarily from politicians and other government officials seeking Dewey's help or support for their campaigns, bills, and other political projects and endeavors.

### **Legislative** sub-series

This series contains the proposed bills, research, communication and lobbying for and by Dewey Short during the 71<sup>st</sup> & 74<sup>th</sup>-84<sup>th</sup> Congresses. Short's constituent services are deeply entwined with his legislative work, as most proposed bills were to benefit the voters who reached out to him. Also included are Short's activities with the Republican National Committee and conventions. The series is arranged chronologically.

### **Case Files** sub-series

This series consists of Dewey Short's work with veterans, or their living relatives, on a case-by-case basis, who were seeking benefits such as pensions from the U.S. Government or medical care from a veteran's hospital and were initially denied for various reasons. This series is arranged alphabetically by the last name of the veteran, or the person on the specific case. The dates range from the 1930s through the 1950s during Short's elected time in office. These files contain correspondence between Short and his constituents, their family members, his colleagues in congress, top government officials, and often the medical doctor(s) required to prove or disprove certain disabilities and medical conditions.

### **Departmental Correspondence** sub-series

This series includes letters, telegrams, and photographs pertaining to the work Short did for his constituents, with different departments of the government, outside of his work for the committees on which he served. The series is arranged alphabetically by department, and then by the specific case or issue being addressed. The letters and telegrams include Short's correspondence with department officials, their staff, and any other person(s) involved in the case. Several folders are cases of Dewey working with the Department of Agriculture solving problems for the cattle, poultry, dairy, and meat industry in Missouri, along with helping farmers re-seed their land, and overcome droughts and floods. The photographs contained in this series are all photos of the damage done to farms, specifically crops killed by drought.

### **Committee Work** sub-series

The Committee Work series primarily contains records of the work Dewey Short was involved with while serving on the Armed Services Committee, which was formerly known as the Committee on Military Affairs before it was changed in 1947. Short served on the committee from 1935-1956, first as a member and then eventually chairing the committee from 1953-1955. The records consist of correspondence, telegrams, photographs, brochures, and maps of the work performed throughout his career on the committee. A small portion of this series is dedicated to the National Rivers and Harbors Congress, for which Short was a member from 1937-1939. This series is arranged alphabetically first by committee name and then by the case within the specific committee.

The congressman dedicated much of his time and work on the committee to flood control, which this series highlights. The correspondence and telegrams described in the series are to and from Short from colleagues, contractors bidding for all the jobs needed to complete projects like the Table Rock Dam and defense projects like the building of airports and bases in Missouri. The letters and telegrams contained in the series also include words of support and opposition to military affairs and defense projects, dependence on crude oil, flood control and the building of dams, Universal Military Training, and all the trips he made touring the world for military affairs, especially the congressional delegation to tour concentration camps in Germany after World War II, in 1945. The photographs, brochures, and maps are primarily of the documentation of the building and construction of Table Rock Dam, and the building of forts, bases, airports, and military machinery such as the B-36 Bomber. Included are photographs of key military personnel in every branch of the armed services.

### **Office Files** sub-series

This series is comprised of the files kept by Short's three secretaries, Miss Irene Lewis, Miss Mary Alice Sanders, and Mrs. Helen Pauly. The files span 1939-1957, bulk 1952-1956. Most of the files are "General Correspondence," which includes any letter sent to Congressman Short. The letters include constituent requests for assistance, lobbying for specific interests, praise and complaints about Short's work, notifications about Missourians' attitudes, invitations to speak, updates on Missouri's issues, and both personal and professional correspondence about Short's life and work. Among the constituent requests are incarcerated civilians and soldiers appealing conviction. Also included are Intra-Office correspondence, research on Missouri, visitor requests, itineraries, unusual letters, and notes about gifts both from and to Dewey Short.

### **Scrapbooks** sub-series

This sub-series is within “Office Files” and compiled by Short’s secretaries. “Scrapbooks” contains a multi-media Scrapbook that reflects Short’s work from 1954-1961, bulk 1957-1960. “Scrapbook #1” contains photographs, invitations, article clippings, and photographs. “Scrapbook #2” is part of “Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil-Military Affairs)” Series.

### **Assistant Secretary of the Army (Civil-Military Affairs) Series**

This series primarily consists of speeches, trip files, and correspondence from Short’s time as an Assistant Secretary of the Army from March 1957-January 1961. Text of Short’s speeches given to citizen groups often discuss Cold War issues and the Communist threat. Also included are statements before Congress and ceremonies attended. Speeches are arranged chronologically. Trip files, also chronological, document both domestic and international travel to military facilities. Of note is his Far East inspection trip in the summer of 1960, in which he traveled throughout Asia. These files include numerous photographs of Short with various dignitaries. Correspondence is grouped by year. Within each year, incoming letters, attachments, and replies are filed together under the first letter of the last name of the correspondent. Like the general correspondence in the Office Files series, letters include requests for assistance, notes about gifts and visits, and some personal correspondence. Also included in this series are files documenting conferences and meetings, legislation, Short’s memberships in the National Rivers and Harbors Congress and the Civil War Centennial Commission, research files, office files, and newspaper clippings. The clippings files include a scrapbook with an almost exclusive emphasis on Assistant Secretary Short’s work opening post offices in states bordering the Mississippi River.

### **Photographs series**

This series includes several folders of portraits of Dewey Short from the 1930s through the 1950s. Most of the series documents Short’s work on the Military Affairs Committee and include his visits to a variety of military bases through the United States, including Hawaii. Photos of Table Rock Dam and Bull Shoals are included as well as photos documenting his trip to Japan and the Middle East 1946 and 1947. The photos range in date from the 1920s to 1960 and are arranged alphabetically by subject. This series includes one oversize box of signed photographs sent to Dewey Short from members of the Armed Services Committee and high-ranking military personnel.

### **Audiovisual series**

This series contains video tape, audio tape, and audio discs that record Dewey Short addresses to the public while on the campaign trail or the Republican Congressional Committee promoting republican candidates and ideals. Included in this series is both video and audio of President Dwight Eisenhower speaking to republican audiences and May Kennedy McCord “First Lady of the Ozarks” speaking on behalf of Dewey Short for his renomination to Congress. This series is arranged by media type.

### **Oversize series**

This series includes early campaign posters, certificates, and oversize photographs, mainly of Dewey Short attending various banquets, and some of Short involved with committee work, arranged by type of material, 1913-1960. Also included is one volume documenting Short’s campaign for the US Senate in 1932.
