#### **Historical Note:**

Mildred Kittell was born on September 22, 1895, in Halstead, Kansas, to George H. and Kate Fisher Kittell. Mildred began her primary education studies at Westport High, in Westport, Missouri, and later graduated from Canon City High School in Colorado. She earned a degree in teaching at the Kansas State Teacher's College in Emporia, Kansas.

In 1917, Mildred moved back to Kansas City, Missouri, and began work as a physical education teacher for five local grade schools. She retired from teaching in the 1960s.

In 1966, Mildred began writing a Friday editorial feature for the *Kansas City Times* titled, "Post Cards From Old Kansas City." She utilized her extensive postcard collection as the medium through which she told the history of Kansas City, Missouri. She spent long hours researching the history the postcards depicted at the Kansas City Public Library's Missouri Valley Special Collections. Mildred's column ran for twenty-three years, between 1968 and 1991.

Mildred married Samuel (Sam) H. Ray on November 27, 1918, in Kansas City, Missouri. Together they had three children. Ray died on April 5, 1996, at the age of 100, and is buried at the Forest Hill Cemetery in Kansas City, Missouri.

The collection has been arranged into ten folders.

## **Scope and Content Note:**

The collection consists of correspondence, genealogy research conducted by Mildred Kittell Ray, family photographs, newspaper clippings, and documents pertaining to the Fisher and Taylor families. Additional materials include two diaries kept by Abel Fisher concerning his trip to California and his early years in Kansas City, Missouri.

Note that folder ten contains letters written by both John and James Taylor while living in Kansas City, Missouri, to their parents in Oldham, England. The letters were encapsulated for preservation purposes and transferred to an oversize folder.
