The collection includes correspondence, Civil War service records, business and property records, artifacts, and ephemera pertaining to Robert Thompson Van Horn. Additional materials include the papers of Van Horn's granddaughter, Adela Cooley Van Horn, who traveled extensively.

Robert Thompson Van Horn was born on May 19, 1824, in Indiana County, Pennsylvania, to Henry and Elizabeth Thompson Van Horn. Between 1843 and 1855, Van Horn was a printer apprentice and journeyman. He also briefly, taught school, worked on the Erie Canal, studied law, and operated a steamboat. Van Horn married Adela Honeywood Cooley on December 2, 1848, in Pomeroy, Ohio. Van Horn moved to Kansas City, Missouri, in 1855 and purchased the weekly newspaper *The Enterprise* (later the *Western Journal of Commerce* and the *Western Journal of Commerce*). He served as a postmaster for Kansas City between 1857 and 1861.

During the American Civil War, Van Horn commanded the 25th Regiment of the Missouri Volunteer Infantry. Upon returning to Kansas City after being wounded at the Battle of Lexington, Van Horn was elected to the Missouri Senate in 1862 and two years later was elected Mayor of Kansas City. He served two terms as a United States Congressman for Missouri and was instrumental in securing legislation for the creation of Hannibal Bridge and expanding the railroad services through Kansas City. He was later appointed the regional tax collector by President Ulysses S. Grant, a position that Van Horn held until 1881. Van Horn died on January 3, 1916, in Clay County, Missouri, and is buried at the Mount Washington Cemetery in Independence, Missouri.
