The collection consists of correspondence and postcards, in both English and Japanese, financial materials, class notes, a photograph (individuals are identified in Japanese), and ephemeral material pertaining to Kenkichi Furuichi, a Japanese dentist in Kansas City, Kansas.

Kenkichi Furuichi was born in Tokyo, Japan. In 1919, he immigrated to the United States and attended the Kansas City-Western Dental College where he earned a degree in dentistry in 1921. After graduation, Furuichi moved to New York where he attended the Rochester Dental Dispensary.
