The collection consists of photographs taken by Edgar Allison Linton during his travels to Europe, Central America, and Asia between 1910 and 1916. Additional materials include research on Linton and information regarding his travel narrative, which appeared in the May 26, 1912, issue of *The Kansas City Star*.

Edgar Allison Linton was born on October 23, 1883, in Clinton, Iowa, to Alfred and Rebecca Linton. He graduated from Central High School in 1903 and attended the University of Kansas between 1903 and 1905. Linton worked as a teacher and later in a commercial photographer's studio in Kansas City, Missouri. Between 1910 and 1916, Linton began traveling extensively to Europe, Central America, and Asia. In 1912, he wrote an article for *The Kansas City Star* titled, "How I Worked My Way Around the World."

From 1923 to 1924, Linton was affiliated with the WDAF radio program "School of the Air," in conjunction with *The Kansas City Star*. On the program, Linton spoke of his many travels abroad. Later in life, he gave educational lectures on his travels abroad across the Midwest using his travel photographs. Linton died on April 14, 1972, in Kansas City, Missouri, and his body was donated to the University of Missouri-Kansas City School of Medicine for research purposes.
