The collection consists of publicity materials, photographs, newsletters, and related ephemera concerning the Linwood Theater in Kansas City, Missouri. Theater manager Leo R. Davis compiled the bulk of the materials.

The Linwood Theater was constructed for Joseph O. Fisher by theater architect, Carl Boller between 1914 and 1915. *The Kansas City Star* reported that the theater was the "finest and largest suburban theater in the city" when it opened on December 16, 1915. The theater was located at 31<sup>st</sup> Street and Prospect Avenue in Kansas City, Missouri. It was remodeled in 1922. The theater closed in the late 1960s.
