**DESCRIPTION:**

The collection includes original magazine publications. Included in each publication are: a study and description of the cover art or other famous works of art; short stories and serials; articles about famous people, some with local connections; photographs of area homes, people, events; photographs of national or international interest; society news; fashion illustrations by Edna Marie Dunn; illustrated poetry and cartoons by Dale Beronius; and advertisements for local businesses. Early issues contained bible stories. The cover and back pages are printed on smooth paper with full color illustrations, several by Leroy Daniel McMorris. Of particular interest is a series of fashion illustrations by Homer Conant described as "America's Foremost Designer". The "Costumes A Series" appeared from December 6-27, 1925.
