**Historical Note:**

Lloyd Herbert Coale was born on March 10, 1913, in Kansas City, Kansas, to John T. Coale and Margaret A. Lewis.

Lloyd Coale received his bachelor's and doctorate degrees in medicine from the University of Kansas. He was a captain in the Army Medical Corps during World War II, and served in New Guinea and the Philippines. After his military service, he was a resident at the University of Kansas Medical School.

In 1963, Dr. Coale was elected as president of the Wyandotte County Tuberculosis and Health Association. He served on the staff at the Veteran's Administration Hospital and at Bethany Hospital for 26 years and retired from his practice in 1976. After his retirement, Dr. Coale was a consultant to the Social Security Administration in Kansas City, Missouri. He was also a member of the Mensa and Alpha Omega Alpha honorary medical fraternity.

Dr. Coale died at the Shawnee Gardens Nursing Center on March 22, 1995. He is buried at the Highland Park Cemetery in Kansas.
