BIOGRAPHY:

Estelle Rose was a member of the confirmation class of 1944 at the Congregation Keneseth Israel-Beth Sholom Synagogue School. She graduated from Southwest High School in 1945 and Junior College in Kansas City, Missouri in 1947. She was a founding member of a social organization, Kappa Tau Sorority in 1946.

Estelle was president of Heart of America B'nai B'rith Women #527 from 1971-1972. She is a member of the National Council of Jewish Women.

Born June 14, 1923. Fred S. Berman served in the United States Army from January 23, 1943 until October 24, 1945. He was a member of an intelligence unit and the "Richie Boys". He was a member of the B'nai B'rith District Two Board in 1972-1973. He was president of Hatikvah Lodge #1741 in 1980-1981 and the Kansas City B'nai B'rith Greater Kansas City Council. Died August 24, 1982.

Estelle and Fred married July 3, 1949.
