#### **Historical Note:**

Helen Seibert Thomes was born on September 26, 1884, one of eight children, to John E. Thomes and Fannie Seibert in Kansas City, Missouri. Her father, a civil engineer, was an early builder of railroads and bridges in the Kansas City Metropolitan area.

Little information is known regarding Helen Thomes' early years. She opened and operated the Helen Thomas School of Dancing from 1910 to 1942 when she retired. The original studio was located in Morthon's Hall at the corner of Westport Road and Main Street; later the studio moved to Drexel Hall at the corner of Lindwood Boulevard and Main Street. In 1922, a building was constructed for the dance school at the corner of 40<sup>th</sup> Street and Baltimore Avenue.

Helen Seibert Thomes passed away on June 21, 1958, and is buried at the Mount Washington Cemetery in Independence, Missouri.

## **Scope and Content Note:**

The collection contains sixty undated, hand-written choreographies for dances utilized by the school. The dances range from ballet, clog, and tap dancing to waltz and Irish dances.
