The Fellowship House was founded in March 1946 by a group composed of members of the Fellowship of Reconciliation Committee, the Committee for the Practice of Democracy, and the Penn Valley Quakers. The purpose of the association was “to promote mutual understanding, fellowship and respect among the people of the community through programs and projects which were designed to replace fiction with fact, conflict with cooperation, fear with love, and distrust with faith, to the end of developing a community free of prejudice, discrimination and intolerance.”
