Historical Note:

The Boller Brothers were architects that specialized in designing movie theaters in the early 20th century. Carl Boller started out as a scenery artist for his brother Will's vaudeville troupe. The first movie theater Carl designed was the La Belle Theatre in Pittsburg, Kansas in 1903. By 1905, Carl opened his own architectural business called Carl Boller, Architect. His younger brother Robert joined the business as an apprentice draftsman in the same year. The business was renamed Boller Brothers around 1920. Originally based in Kansas City, the Boller Brothers opened offices in Los Angeles in the 1920s as movie theaters grew in popularity. They designed movie theaters throughout the Midwest and Southwest. In Kansas City, the Boller Brothers designed the Midland Theatre and the Plaza Theatre among others in Kansas City and throughout Missouri.

Scope and Content Note:

This issue of *Motion Picture News: Theatre Building and Equipment Buyers Guide*, Section Two published on June 22, 1929, consists of advertisements for movie theater equipment and articles on movie theater architecture. The articles focus on how movie theater buildings will have to evolve to accommodate air conditioning and the advent of sound films. The issue also celebrates the work of the Boller Brothers, who were Kansas City-based architects specializing in movie theaters across the Midwest and Southwest. The magazine includes photographs and drawings of movie theaters designed by the Boller Brothers as well as interviews with them.
