Abstract: The Paul A. Wobus Papers contain the personal and professional papers of Reverend Paul A. Wobus of Manchester, Missouri. The papers include Wobus's uncompleted and unpublished memoirs, photographs, correspondence, materials concerning Mount Zion Community Church and the Ozark Community Council, historical notes concerning Wobus's avocational interest in the mills and railroads in the regions, miscellaneous newspaper clippings and other printed materials, narrative accounts of many of his trips into the Ozarks. Also included are 89 small notebooks, dated from 1938-1972, in which he kept records of his mileage, routes, schedules, expenses, and places and person visited.

Biographical Note:

Reverend Paul A. Wobus was born in St. Charles, Missouri, on February 14, 1893. His father, Reinhard Wobus, was pastor of the Evangelical Church there. Paul Wobus died on December 11, 1982 in Concordia, Missouri. He attended Eden Seminary in Saint Louis and became pastor in the Evangelical Synod of North America (became Evangelical and Reformed Church in 1934, and the United Church of Christ in 1957).

In 1922, Wobus was named pastor of St. John Evangelical Church in Manchester, Missouri, an appointment he held until 1969. In 1918, he married Olga Kruse, and they had four children: Wilbert, Dorothy, Paul Jr., and Ethel. In 1921, Wobus, who earned a degree in Rural Sociology at the University of Missouri-Columbia, wrote an article about the state of religion in the Ozarks, thereupon the Evangelical Synod began to underwrite his rural missionary work in the region. A proponent of nondenominational "community churches," Wobus made several hundred trips from his home base in Manchester into the Missouri Ozarks during a period of over thirty years. He became particularly active in Reynolds, Dent, and Shannon counties. His most notable undertaking was the founding in 1929, of the Shannondale Community Church-Center in northern Shannon County. He also served as missionary to the Mount Zion Community Church at Akers in Dent County for twenty-four years.

Scope and Content Note:

Personal Papers

This series consists of personal research and memoirs regarding Reverend Paul Wobus's mission work in the Ozarks. The research includes histories of Ozark counties, maps, correspondence, and notes about his travels. Wobus compiled his research and memories of his travels into a memoir. Of note are the collection of newspaper articles in folder 7 concerning the proposal and designation of the Ozark National Scenic Riverways as a national monument. This series is arranged in its original order.

Correspondence

This series contains letters written to and from Reverend Paul Wobus. Most of the letters deal with Wobus's mission work in the Missouri Ozarks, namely his work with rural churches and

communities. There are also correspondence with newspapers, publishing companies, and historical societies about publishing articles he had written regarding the history of the Ozarks and of churches in the areas he served. Folder 11 contains letters written by Wobus to his mother written in German. Dr. Petra DeWitt has translated the letters into English, a copy of which is with each letter. This series is arranged chronologically.

Publications

This series consists of newspaper articles written about church work in rural communities within the Ozarks. Many of these articles were published in the *Evangelical Herald* or *Evangelical Chronicle*. There are also church publications, such a church bulletins and pamphlets printed for special occasions, conferences, conventions, and guest speakers. This series is arranged in chronological order.

Scrapbooks

This series contains scrapbooks compiled by Paul Wobus. The scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings with stories on local topics, obituaries, and local mission work. The articles come mostly from Dent County, with one scrapbook dedicated to the wider Ozark region. A name and subject index for each scrapbook is available in each folder. This series is arranged chronologically.

Miscellaneous

This series contains the responses to surveys regarding the religious situations in neglected sections of Ozark counties. The *Evangelical Herald*, under the editor Reverend J.H. Hortsmann, sent out these surveys to different church leaders throughout the Ozarks. This series is arranged in chronological order.

Narratives

This series consists of unpublished narrative accounts of Paul Wobus's trips in the Ozarks from 1926 to 1973. The narratives contain information on how and where he traveled, stories of those he visited, and spots of local interest he visited in his travels. Wobus was interested in the areas mill and natural wonders. An index of his trips is available in the collections administration folder. This series is arranged chronologically.

Notebooks

This series contains 89 small notebooks in which Paul Wobus kept records of his mileage, routes, schedules, expenses, and places and persons visited during his trips. This series is arranged chronologically.
