# **Biographical Note:**

Members of the Saucier and Duclos families arrived in Quebec, Canada from France in 1666 and 1645, respectively. Both families had members who served in the French military throughout the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. Francois Saucier, an engineer, designed Fort Chartres, near Kaskaskia, Illinois in 1752. Alexander Decelle Duclos commanded French troops at Fort Chartes prior to his death in 1775. Descendants of these men located in Sainte Genevieve, Missouri by 1750s.
