Historical Note:

Sainte Genevieve, Missouri was founded in the 1730s-1740s by French Canadians and migrants from Illinois. The oldest permanent settlement in Missouri, its early settlers were drawn to the area for the salt springs, desirable farmland, and proximity to the Mississippi River.
