Biographical Note:

William Washington Megee was born on November 21, 1850, in Mississippi to Daniel W. and Haley Dunbar Megee. He married Sarah C. in Ozark County in the fall of 1869. Together they had thirteen children, seven of which were living in 1900.

Vernon E. Megee was born on June 5, 1900, in Tulsa, Oklahoma to George D. and Dora Henderson Megee. He enlisted in the United States Marine Corp in 1919 and served during both World War II and the Korean War. After an exemplary career he settled in Texas. He died in Albuquerque, New Mexico in 1992 and was buried at Arlington National Cemetery.
