Biographical Note:

Samuel Aaron Harrison was born in Hazelton, Texas County, Missouri on April 10, 1842. He served with the Eighth Missouri Volunteers (Confederate) during the Civil War, and was captured. He was interred at Gravois Prison in Saint Louis before being transferred to the prisoner-of-war camp in Alton, Illinois. In 1938, he visited the prison and selected a stone from its walls that later served as his headstone. He was the last serving prisoner who were imprisoned at Alton. He died at home in Anutt, Dent County, Missouri on August 30, 1940.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection contains a photocopy of "Samuel Aaron Harrison, 1842-1940: His Ancestors and Descendants," by S. Claude Null. It is an account of the life of Harrison, with detailed genealogical information. Included is an "Insert on the Ancestry of Presidents Harrison," and a general history of the surname Harrison. Most of the volume is devoted to an organized listing of Samuel A. Harrison's many descendants by family group. An index to the volume is available in the collection's administration folder.
