**Historical Note:**

The Grand Army of the Republic was a national association of Civil War veterans of the Federal service. The post at Lebanon was primarily a social organization, but its members did provide

some relief to local needy veterans, and some of its members made donations to the Confederate Home of Missouri at Higginsville. The post commemorated Memorial Day with annual ceremonies, sometimes in cooperation with the local chapter of the United Confederate Veterans. The post was named for Major General George G. Meade, known for his victory at Gettysburg.

### **Scope and Content Note:**

#### **Records**

This series consists of two ledgers and a minute book. The ledgers contain individual accounts of membership, transfers, deaths and suspensions, and the Post's financial records. Volume one includes an index in the front. The minute book contains the minutes of meetings, post records, and eulogies for deceased members. This series is arranged chronologically.

#### **Miscellaneous Papers**

This series contains miscellaneous papers pertaining to the running of the George G. Mead Post No. 48. They include membership lists and applications, some genealogical information, and financial papers. This series is arranged in its original order.
