Biographical Note:

Frederick Hauenstein was a native of Tuscumbia, Missouri. He graduated from the Westminster College at Fulton, where he received the Bachelor of Science degree in 1900, and from the Missouri School of Mines and Metallurgy at Rolla, where he received a degree in engineering in 1903. After his graduation, he took a position in a coal gasification plant at St. Joseph, Missouri. Later he worked as a draftsman, surveyor, and engineer on a number of mining and railroad projects in Arizona, California, Colorado, and Nevada. Hauenstein moved to Fort Towson, Oklahoma, in 1915, to become chief engineer of the Pine Belt Lumber Company. His association with the Pine Belt lasted several years, and he was the last president of the company.

Scope and Content Note:

The collection contains a photocopy of Frederick Hauenstein's autobiography. An engineering graduate of the Missouri School of Mines (now Missouri University of Science and Technology), he worked as a surveyor and engineer in the western United States, and was the last president of the Pine Belt Lumber Company in Oklahoma. The most detailed segment of the work describes the operation of the Pine Belt Lumber Company and its log-hauling railroad in Oklahoma. There are also brief accounts of Hauenstein's boyhood in Tuscumbia, Missouri, his work as a welding inspector in the Bethlehem naval shipyard at San Francisco during World War II, and a visit to Rolla in 1978, on the occasion of the seventy-fifth anniversary of his graduation.
